

Bioengineering & Riparian Restoration Project Site Tour

California Conservation Corps, Ojai Valley Land Conservancy, Natural Resources Conservation Service, and California Department of Fish and Game invite you to the Ventura River Watershed.

Please join us for a tour of two local project sites that have utilized bioengineering techniques to stabilize and naturally restore the bank and improve riparian plant cover.



Project Site #1 - The Ventura River Bank

Restoration Project at the confluence of San Antonio Creek and Ventura River, installed willow baffles on a property easement of OVLC. This project was implemented fall of 2006 and already the baffles have experienced quite a bit of new growth.

Project Site #2 - Lion Creek Bank

Stabilization Project was implemented on a private landowner's property fall of 2005. A willow mattress was installed along 150 ft of bank at the confluence of Lion and San Antonio Creeks. Now nearly 1 ½ years later, the willow is 6 ft tall in places.



Tour participants will meet at 8:30am under the Hwy 33 overpass at the Casitas View Rd Exit then carpool to the sites via van transportation. Parking space is limited so please carpool to the meeting location. There is no charge for participation or transportation.
